

MPAI-4 Admission and Discharge T-Scores



The **MPAI-4** is the backbone of our outcome measurement system because of its focus on function rather than impairment. The MPAI-4 has a total of 29 items assigned to 3 subscales: **Abilities** (mobility, communication, memory and problem solving), **Adjustment** (anxiety, depression, anger, pain and awareness), and **Participation** (individual's ability to care for themselves, to participate socially, work, manage leisure time, manage money and initiate activities). For each item, it is not if the individual has the impairment, but how much that impairment is impacting their everyday functioning that drives the rating.

Our philosophy and approach drive clinical outcomes and long-term cost reductions – two things that we believe go hand in hand. For those clients in our intensive neurorehabilitation and neurobehavioral programs, the goal is to demonstrate progress, reflected by a decrease in scores (the higher the score, the greater the impairment). A decrease in T-score means improvement which ultimately means cost savings.

Our T-scores show that, on average, the individuals we serve are complex and high in severity and on discharge show marked improvement. Early, intensive rehabilitation with individualized therapy, greater focus on independence, and building life skills yield a successful outcome and considerable cost savings over the life of the claim.

Vocational Services

One of the most common goals of our clients is to get back to work, and the ReMed team embraces this challenge. Once a client is ready to begin the process of community re-entry, vocational planning becomes critical. Return to work is complex and success is correlated with a number of things including severity of injury, pre-injury employment type, age of worker, behavioral and cognitive barriers, family and community support, and available employment opportunities. Successful return to work relies on an individual's ability to utilize strategies, work independently, follow nonverbal cues, as well as, motor control and ambulation, self-awareness related to deficits, abilities, job selection and performance. It also relies on the availability of a rehab team with expertise in return to work for individuals with brain injury.

Supported Living Services

Some individuals with brain injury require residential supported living services for an extended period of time. Our Supported Living System serves individuals with the goal of creating a meaningful life and maintaining medical and behavioral stability.

Due to the majority of 2020 being the year of the COVID pandemic, we tracked employment data for clients who were already employed and whether or not they were able to maintain that employment during the pandemic. Employment includes competitive and supported employment as well as volunteer positions. 70% of those who were employed maintained their employment status during 2020. One of the employed individuals was furloughed in April and resumed employment in September.

What does this mean for individuals we serve?

Our Supported Living clients actively participate in the community and report high levels of satisfaction with their vocational/ avocational and leisure activities. The health and wellness of our Supported Living clients is closely monitored through:

- ◆ early intervention protocols (including pulmonary vests, hydration flushes and antibiotic initiation with concurrent culture and sensitivities) mitigate likelihood of hospitalization*
- ◆ wellness programs (healthy eating, smoking cessation, exercise) that keep our clients healthy and engaged in maintaining their health so that they can remain active
- ◆ vocational/avocational and meaningful leisure activities that keep our clients engaged in life and serve to help them maintain or improve their level of cognitive functioning and mood

*Our early intervention protocols allow us to safely and effectively treat these issues in our residential settings. The success of these protocols rely on the treatment team's increased awareness of subtle changes (fatigue, cognition, balance) which can be early signs of medical complications. In 2020, **Early Intervention Protocols** were utilized in **72 episodes of care, with only 2 of these requiring further treatment** in a hospital setting. Similarly, our neurobehavioral team has expertise in the management of complex behavioral issues including aggression, co-occurring mental health issues or addiction.

Since 1984, we have provided specialized brain injury rehabilitation and supported living services to individuals with brain injuries. Our team is known for clinical expertise as well as serving individuals with brain injury who are complex and require high levels of care.. Our programs focus on independence and real life skills, and our outcomes reflect this goal . Individuals served in our programs, consistently demonstrates progress in returning to home, the community, work and greater independence.

Because of the specialty nature of the services we offer and our demonstrated outcomes, we attract individuals from all over the United States. Ours Admission Department works closely with the individual, their family, and the referral source to ensure a smooth transition.

Our outcomes consistently reflect significant treatment progress whether the individual is being served for a short time or a lifetime.

Family involvement is an important part of treatment. Our Rehabilitation Case Managers (RCM) are assigned to work with each clients and is the point person for the family to ensure that families get the information they need, including updates about treatment, brain injury education, and inclusion in treatment planning process. Regular team meetings are held to discuss progress and we consider the family to be an integral part of the team.
